1	Traffic and road crossings / road to Blashenwell, road to Church Knowle and main road at Castle View	Traffic on roads, especially tight corners by river. Narrow road with poor visibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff must be at front and rear of group, wear reflective waistcoats and assist supervising crossing roads
2	Horses	Horses approaching pupils on the common	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brief pupils to remain calm if horses approach, staff to ward horses away. The area where horses are most likely to be encountered is at the cattle grid and gate at grid reference 958814
3	Footbridges over river	All are narrow and slippery -	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff must be at available to help children across the bridges
4	Cattle Grids across road	Injury from tripping on or slipping into cattle grids	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Avoid cattle grids by using gates
5	River	Deep water especially Corfe River. Disease in water Steep/high river banks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brief pupils to take care on river banks Make sure pupils use alcohol hand gel after every river site Carry throwline Walk group a safe distance away from river bank
