1	Narrow pavements	Children straying off the pavements Pavements are narrow in places	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children briefed to stay in single file and to be aware of traffic at all times • Staff to lead group at all times • Wear reflective waistcoats if necessary
2	Exposure / weather	The route is exposed to the wind - there is little shelter at any point	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Appropriate clothing and equipment. Consider use of minibus to minimise time spent walking.
3	From Herston Station	steps, narrow lane, road crossing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Get pupils into single file, brief them to take care on steps and stay in single file along lane.
