1	Ground Conditions	The areas used can become very muddy, with areas of very deep mud in some specific places, especially adjacent to the new farm buildings opposite South Barn.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Detailed check of conditions beforehand – brief supervisory staff, alter position of supervisory staff if required, change routes if required, check footwear
2	Communication	Distance makes communication difficult, especially in poor visibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use fully charged walkie talkie radios – demonstrate how to use them, have mobile phones and exchange numbers to use as a back up. Ensure staff have system of recording position and progress of all groups of pupils around the routes.
3	Members of the public	Public footpaths in area, pupils remote from direct supervision	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure you have adequate numbers of staff in appropriate positions, ensure communication systems are working.
4	Exposure	Area is very exposed to the weather	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check clothing and weather forecast beforehand
5	Injury	Pupils are remote from immediate first aid	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Supervisory staff should carry first aid kits
