| 1 | Lack of supervision | Accident/issue as below due to lack of effective supervision | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow SAGE guidance, focus on time of year and nature of the group |
| 2 | Indecent Exposure by members of the public | Members of the public / naturist Members of the public, very busy beach | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow separate guidelines regarding cases of indecent exposure. |
| 3 | Exposure to sun / wind / cold | Lack of shelter on beach and in dunes | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check weather forecast beforehand and ensure that appropriate equipment and clothing is carried. Sun cream and appropriate clothing required |
| 4 | Lost pupils/Abduction | Members of the public, very busy beach | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure that the group is closely monitored on the beach and in the dunes. The beach can be very busy with both holidaymakers and other school parties. Staff to supervise on the beach, define area for children to play, keep all children within sight at all times, have a whistle to call children back, phone beach warden or police if staff notice anything suspicious. |
| 5 | Adders, Ticks & Plants | Some poisonous plants and animals Tick Bites / LYMES DISEASE/ ENCEPHALITIS | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brief pupils re Adders, Ticks (e.g. Lyme's disease) and Fungi Brief pupils and staff on procedure for checking for ticks and advise to wear long sleeved trousers and t-shirts REFER TO SEPARATE GUIDELINES FOR LYMES DISEASE AND ENCEPHALITIS |
| 6 | Horses | Horse Riders on beach | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure an adult is at the front of the group at all times. |
| 7 | Bog pools | Deep bog pools, steep/overhanging edges | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Avoid the edges of bog pools and bomb craters wherever possible |
| 8 | The Sea | Paddling, swimming, freak waves and wash from ferries. | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No pupils should paddle or swim in the sea unless accompanied by a qualified lifeguard. A throw line should be carried when working on the shoreline. Siphonophore –Portugese Man O'War have been found washed up onto the beaches. These sting even when washed up. Do not allow students near. |
| 9 | Equipment | Injury to pupils / members of the public, damage to environment through inappropriate route / behaviour | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brief all pupils on the safe method of carrying ranging poles, quadrats etc. Make sure that tapes crossing paths are clearly marked and that soil test kits are carefully used in the reserve. |

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| 10 | Damage to the Dune Environment | Injury to pupils / members of the public, damage to environment through inappropriate route / behaviour | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Limit soil sampling. Stay on pre-existing paths whenever possible. Stress the vulnerability of the sand dune ecosystem to all pupils. |
| 11 | Dog mess on beach and in dunes | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check area beforehand. Carry baby wipes in rucksack. |
| 12 | Red End Point - cliffs and rock pools | Loose crumbling cliffs and slippery rocks - route only accessible at low tide | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brief pupils to stay away from cliff base - check tides before planning to walk past RedEnd point on the rocks, take great care on slippery rocks |
| 13 | Ordnance | Live ammunition was used here for training purposes during WW2 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Leave any suspicious items alone, note its position and report to the beach warden or police as soon as possible |
| 14 | Re routed coast path and landslide at middle and south beaches | | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Leader needs to be aware of the current route of the coast path due to various small landslides at Middle and South Beaches - these occurred in the winter of 13/14 and are affecting access to certain parts of the beaches. |

Please attempt to get a description of the offender, note exactly where the incident occurred and to obtain independent witnesses if possible. The police

may ask you to give a formal statement and this information is essential
