1	Lack of effective supervision	Poor behavior can lead to accidents by the river's edge Younger groups need close supervision when working in the river	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Following SAGE guidance (location and activity), LH strongly recommends that one LH tutor works with no more than 30 students. School staff to student ratio should be 1:10 minimum with Primary aged children ideally working in small groups (6 children) per adult.
2	Traffic	Car park and narrow pavements, school and hospital traffic, 2 roads to cross	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff to wear reflective waistcoats, group walk single file with staff at front and rear, ensure appropriate road crossings.
3	Cattle Grid	Tripping up/injury from cattle grid	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use gate adjacent to grid rather than allow pupils to risk walking on the cattle grid.
4	Horses and cows	There are a large number of horses and cows kept on the common who can, at times, prove to be a real nuisance and hazard to groups walking on the track and working beside the river	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff to carry dipping nets to help ward off the horses/cows if they approach too closely. Keep group calm, walk single file with staff to supervise and reassure pupils if required. Avoid giving the horses/cows any food and try to keep them away from the river bank by closing the gate if appropriate.
5	Equipment		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brief pupils on how to carry and use equipment safely, especially tapes and nets
6	River Banks	The river banks are undercut in some places	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check the banks immediately on arrival and mark our safe areas for pupils to work. Throwline to be carried and accessible when at river bank.
7	Water / currents etc	Deeper channels on north (furthest) side of river, deeper further downstream	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is important that all staff leading work at West Mills are familiar with the site and know the characteristics of the river fully. Throwline to be carried and accessible when at river bank. Brief pupils on which areas of the river to work in (avoid very deep/fast flowing water).

8	Weir	Strong undercurrent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Brief pupils to avoid approaching the weir when in the river, close supervision. Throwline to be carried and accessible when at river bank.
9	River bed	Sharp stones	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All pupils working in the river MUST have some form of footwear on.
10	Exposure	Little shelter from wind, rain or sun	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check weather forecast and pupils clothing beforehand, carry extra clothing in case of unintentional immersion.
11	Hygiene and disease	Dirty water on hands whilst eating, Weils disease	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Try to plan the day so that lunch is taken before the pupils touch the water, carry hygienic wipes if required. Use alcohol hand gel after being in contact with water. Avoid contact with water if open wounds are present.
12	Water dropwort	Poisoning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Avoid celery like plants with white carrot flowers. Do not touch or eat. Avoid disturbing growing plants as exposed roots could be eaten by cattle which would be fatal.
